 - Click the button at the top to sign in with Google





TRANSFER AGREEMENTS

TAG (Transfer Admission Guarantee): 6/9 UC schools participate & 94-97% of transfers come from community college TAP (Transfer Alliance Program): UCLA

CSU Overview

- 23 campuses
- 2.5 GPA minimum needed to apply
 - 2.4 2.0 may be considered for admission based upon supplemental factors (including household income, GPA in math/science, etc.)
- SAT/ACT scores <u>not</u> considered for admission
- Campus impaction
 - More selective admission criteria
 - 3 categories: non-impacted, some majors impacted, impacted in all majors

- Dominguez Hills
- Monterey Bay



UC Application

- Nine campuses, one application
 - https://apply.universityofcalifornia.edu/my-application/login
 - Application opens: August 1st
 - Filing period: October 1st -November 30th
 - O Due: November 30th
- Do not send any official test scores or transcripts
 - Students self-report grades and scores, and submit official information only to the UC you will attend
 - SAT/ACT scores NOT considered for admission
- No letters of recommendation accepted/required
- Personal Insight Questions 4 out of 8

What to Consider When Applying

- Private colleges can offer generous financial aid packages
- Western Undergraduate Exchange
 - Reduced tuition & fees w/ schools in partnering states
- Every school has different requirements
 - Research requirements for colleges you're interested in
- SAT/ACT Testing
 - Check specific school websites
- Most schools accept the Common Application
 - www.commonapp.org

College Recommendations

- Private and out of state schools may require teacher and/or counselor recommendations
 - Check specific school websites for requirements
- Counselor Recommendations
 - Counselor recommendation packet on Canvas
- Teacher Recommendations
 - Teachers who know you well, give advance notice



Out of State Schools

Merit/need-based scholarships can offset out of state fees.

Pay reduced tuition and fees through Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE).

Standardized Testing

SAT/ACT Testing

- CSU: Test Blind
- UC: Test Blind
- Private Schools: Most are test optional. Check specific school websites for the most current information
 - More private schools are bringing back the SAT/ACT requirement
 - For example, MIT, Georgetown, Purdue, Harvard, Brown,
 Cal Tech, Dartmouth, Yale, and more

Application Deadlines

Regular Decision

Standard deadline for colleges.

Early Action

Considered non-binding. You will receive your admission decision earlier, but you are not required to attend.

Early Decision

Binding decision: If you are admitted, you must attend the college

Restrictive Early Action

You may not apply to an EA, ED, or REA program at any other private college/university in the US.

Rolling Admission

Considers each application as soon as required information has been received.

Should I Apply Early or Regular?

Factors to Consider:

- College search complete or still exploring options?
- School is a top choice (ED: #1 choice) with multiple reasons it is a match academically, socially, geographically, financially
- GPA/Transcript through 11th Grade
 - 7th semester considered for RD only
- SAT/ACT testing (If required by school applying to)
 - Complete or planning to re-test?
- Timeframe of application due dates
 - Additional 2 months to complete essays/applications for RD

*Please be cautious in drawing conclusions from this information. The numbers are useful only as a general guide to selectivity and not as a predictor of your chances for admission to a particular campus.

Keep In Mind...

Ivy Leagues are hyper-selective.

95% of students accepted to Columbia and Brown were in the top 10% of their graduating class.
Only 149 students from all of California were admitted to Princeton's class of 2026.

School	Apps Received	Total Accepted	Acceptance Rate
Harvard	56,937	1,942	3.41%
Columbia	57,129	2,246	3.93%
Brown	51,302	2,609	5.08%
Princeton	39,644	1,782	4.50%

We always encourage students to apply to 1 or 2 reach schools.

Students also need to investigate less selective schools that they would be happy to attend.



HEALTH AND WELLNESS

Your school counselor is here to help!



BALANCE

Consider all factors, including rigor of selected courses, extracurriculars, and responsibilities outside of school.



SLEEP

It is recommended that teenagers average 8-10 hours of sleep each night.

- Seniors must be enrolled in at least 5 courses
- Balance is key
- Finish Health, Visual Performing Arts, PE, etc.
- 215 credits needed for graduation

10 credits of ELA1 and 10 credits of ELA 2 will count toward English credit for graduation.
