






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

 Requirements in both semesters OR earned an overall course grade of 92% and a Writing Assessment Grade of 90%
- Refer to the criteria for Honors/AP social science courses in the <u>Course of Study</u>

Honors English 2

- Based on performance in English 1
- Please refer to the expectation for English Honors/AP placement for further guidance

Honors Next Gen Chemistry Must meet the following criteria:

- 90% or higher in both semesters of Math I
- 90% or higher in Next Gen Biology (both semesters) or 80% or higher in Honors Next Gen Biology (both semesters)
- Teacher Appraisal
