

UNI Graduation Requirements

- ➤ 4 years of English
- ≥ 2 years of Math (Math I, any other math)
- ➤ 2 years of Science
- ➤ 1 year of World Language, Fine Art or CTE
- ➤ 1 year of Global Perspectives
- ➤ 1 year of U.S. History
- ➤ 1 year of Political Science/ Economics
- ➤ 2 years of Physical Education
- ≥ 1 semester of Health



"a-g" UC/CSU Course Requirements

- 4 years of English
- •3 years of Math (Math I, Math II and Math III)
- •2 years of Lab Science (Biological and Physical)
- •2 years of the **same** World Language
- •1 year of Fine Art
- 1 year of Global Perspectives
- •1 year of US History
- 1 year of Political Science/Economics
- 1 year of College Prep. Electives

These are minimum requirements and do not g college or university.



- GPA (Grades 10 and 11 for eligibility)
- Test scores (SAT or ACT, SAT Subject Tests, AP)
- Rigor of course schedule (AP/Honors)
- Personal Insight Questions
- Extracurricular activities
- Special talents
- Academic accomplishments in light of life experiences and special circumstances

- Private colleges can offer generous financial aid packages
- Every school has different requirements
 - Research requirements for each school
- Most schools accept the Common Application
 - www.commonapp.org
- Letters of recommendation from teachers/counselors
 - Counselor recommendation packets
- Submit official transcripts
 - www.parchment.com



OUT-OF STATE

WHAT TO CONSIDER:

- Merit/Need-based scholarships to offset out-of-state fees
- Pay 150% of in-state fees through Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE)

Ivy Leagues are hyper-selective

- Harvard had a 4.59% acceptance rate for 2018 (42,749 applicants; 1,962 admits)
- Harvard receives more applications from Valedictorians alone than there are places in the freshmen class.

• UCLA had a 14.1% acceptance rate for 2018 (113,748 applicants; 16,020 admits)


We always encourage students to apply to 1 or 2 reach schools
