

### **UNI Graduation Requirements**

- ➤ 4 years of English
- ≥ 2 years of Math (Algebra 1, any other math)
- ≥ 2 years of Science
- ≥ 1 year of World Language or Fine Art
- ➤ 1 year of Global Perspectives
- ➤ 1 year of U.S. History
- ➤ 1 year of Political Science/ Economics
- ≥ 2 years of Physical Education
- ≥1 semester of Health



### "a-g" UC/CSU Course Requirements

- 4 years of English
- 3 years of Math (Math 1, Math 2, and Math 3)
- 2 years of Lab Science (Biological and Physical)
- 2 years of the **same** World Language
- 1 year of Fine Art
- 1 year of Global Perspectives
- 1 year of US History
- 1 year of Political Science/Economics
- 1 year of College Prep. Electives

These are minimum requirements and do not guarante university

#### **FACTORS CONSIDERED FOR UC ADMISSION**

- GPA (Grades 10 and 11 for eligibility)
- Test scores (SAT or ACT, SAT Subject Tests)
- Rigor of course schedule (AP/Honors)
- Personal Insight Questions
- Extracurricular activities
- Special talents
- Academic accomplishments in light of life experiences and special circumstances

Which questions you choose is entirely up to you. You should select prompts that are most relevant to your experience and that best reflect your individual circumstances.



# **UC Prompt Writing Tips**

### SHOW, NOT TELL

Think of examples that demonstrate your unique character apart from your grades/test scores

#### **FOCUS AND PROVE**

Narrow your focus and be more specific with your examples

### REVISE, REVISE, REVISE!

Create multiple drafts and get feedback from others

#### WHAT TO CONSIDER WHEN APPLYING:

- Private colleges can offer generous financial aid packages
- Every school has different requirements
  - Research requirements for colleges you're interested in
- Most schools accept the Common Application
  - www.commonapp.org
- Letters of recommendation from teachers/counselors
  - Counselor recommendation packets
- Submit official transcripts
  - www.parchment.com



### OUT-OF STATE

#### WHAT TO CONSIDER:

- Merit/Need-based scholarships to offset out-of-state fees
- Pay in-state fees through Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE)

### APPLICATION DEADLINES

### **Regular Decision**

Standard deadline for colleges

### **Rolling Admissions**

Considers each application as soon as required information has been received

### **Early Action**

Considered non-binding. You will receive your admission decision earlier, but you are not required to attend

### **Restrictive Early Action**

Similar non-binding deadline; however, you cannot apply Early Action or Early Decision to any other colleges

### **Early Decision**

Binding decision - if you are admitted, you must attend the college

### **Should I Apply Early?**

FAQ: Does applying early increase my chance of acceptance? Colleges vary in percentage of early applicants they admit year by year.

#### I should apply EA/ED

- College search complete
- School is a top choice (ED: #1 choice)
   with multiple reasons it is a match academically, socially, geographically
- Strong transcript through 11<sup>th</sup> grade;
   meet/exceeds admission profile
- SAT/ACT testing complete Prepared to present app with essays well before 11/1 to compete in strong, go-getter pool

#### I should apply RD

- Still searching colleges and deciding where to apply
- Not fully committed to attending the college
- Want 7<sup>th</sup> semester grades considered in my app
- Still need to take SAT/ACT tests
- Need more time (2 additional months)
   to complete apps thoroughly and
   complete essays

# Safety Schools

- Your GPA and test scores are well above the average GPA and test scores of the college
- Make sure your safety school is actually a school you could see yourself attending
- Recommended amount: 2 3
- Community college can count as a safety school

## Range Schools

- Your GPA and test scores are similar to the average GPA and test scores of the college
- Recommended number: 4 5

# Reach Schools

- Your GPA and test scores are below the average GPA and test scores of the college
- Recommended amount: as many as you can responsibly handle

# Keep In Mind...

#### Ivy Leagues are hyper-selective

- Harvard had a 4.6% acceptance rate for 2018 (Nearly 42,750 applicants; 1,962 admits)
- Harvard receives more applications from Valedictorians alone than there are places in the freshmen class.

#### **UC Admission**

• UCLA had a 18% acceptance rate for 2018 (97,121 applicants, 17,474 admits); UCLA is the most applied to college in the world

#### We always encourage students to apply to 1 or 2 reach schools

• Students also need to investigate less selective schools that they would be happy to attend.
