

### "A-G" UC/CSU Course Requirements

- 4 years of English
- 3 years of Math (Alg. 1/Math 1, Geom./Math 2, and Alg. 2 or Int. Algebra/Math 3)
- 2 years of Lab Science (Biological and Physical)
- 2 years/levels of the **same** World Language
- 1 year of Visual Performing Art
- 1 year of Global Perspectives/World History
- 1 year of US History
- 1 semester of Political Science & Economics
- 1 year of College Prep. "g" Elective

#### Welcome to The California State University

The Fall 2019 application will be available on October 1, 2018.

Thank you for your interest in The California State University. We hope you will find the online application process to be comprehensive and easy to navigate. You do not need to complete the online application all at once. You may access your application and change your answers as many times as you like by using your login credentials from any computer with internet access. Your application can be completed online and submitted electronically once you have entered the required information.

### **CSU New application changes**

- One application for multiple schools!
- Automatic GPA calculation
- Live chat support for questions about the application
- Enter your classes with a drop down menu
- Specific information/questions for specific campuses



### **CSU Admissions Eligibility**

#### **CSU Admissions Index:**

- GPA x 800 + (New) SAT (CR + M) = 2950 Minimum OR (10 x ACT) + (200 x GPA) = 695 Minimum
- If standard admission, GPA of 3.0 eligible with ANY score for non-impacted campuses
- If selective admission, index required may vary by campus and/or major

# What makes a CSU campus "selective?"

 <u>Campus Impaction</u>: Occurs when a campus receives more eligible applications in the initial filing period than there are enrollment spaces available

- <u>CSU campuses fall into 3 categories</u>:
  - Non-impacted-admit using CSU eligibility
  - Campus impaction (Freshmen and Transfer)
  - Impacted in all programs (all majors)

### CSU Timeline CSU The California State University

#### • Submit application by November 30th

- Send official test scores directly from testing agency.
  - Note: Some colleges will not accept the December test date, please do your research.
- After application has been submitted, student will receive an e-mail from each CSU to open an account.
  - Check account on a weekly basis; you could miss a deadline!
  - Some CSUs may ask for a 7th semester transcript.
- Final Transcript must be sent through Parchment.com!

- You will be notified during the month of March
- Send only <u>ONE</u> intent to register (SIR) by May 1st
- All campuses send out cancellations during the summer based on poor grades during the senior year or misinformation on the application



### Letters of Recommendation



#### **Counselor**

- Students must pick up a counselor recommendation packet from Ms.
   Cochran in the counseling office
- Request a recommendation from your counselor on Common App or school's electronic platform
- Packet must be complete before making an appointment
- Go to parchment.com to order transcripts
- Please allow counselor <u>two</u> weeks to write the letter
- No letters will be written over Winter Break (12/22/18-1/6/19)

#### **Teacher**

- Speak with each individual teacher to request a recommendation
- If he/she is not using electronic submissions, bring teacher forms and stamped addressed envelopes for each school
- If he/she is using Common App/school electronic submission, request a recommendation through Common App

### **Transcripts**

#### How to send transcripts



- Visit Parchment.com. Creating an account takes 5 minutes
  - Make sure you select University High School in Irvine
- ◆ Cost is 5.50
- Send official transcripts online to:
  - Common Application
  - Colleges not on the Common Application
  - Privates, Out of State schools, NCAA
  - Final transcripts to UC's and CSU's
- Orders can be tracked
- Note the following dates:
  - Present: initial transcripts
  - ♦ January 28: first semester grades post
  - Orders will not be processed between Dec 21-Jan 4
  - June 14: final transcript are available to order
  - June 21: LAST day to order final transcripts
  - Allow 3 business days for orders to process

#### In Person:

- Scholarship applications
- Summer Programs
- Mail transcripts for colleges not on Parchment Exchange
- PDF files of transcripts
- Cost is \$5 cash





    - Make sure to check Spam and Junk folders!
- Make sure you are using an appropriate email address
  - spicychick@gmail.com not a good choice!
  - You can't go wrong with your name; it helps colleges find their records

### College Admissions Stress

- Tips on how to help you deal with application stress/anxiety:
  - College admissions essays are important!
    - Start early and review the tips in your handout
  - Be open and honest about college possibilities
    - Be realistic and informed
    - Know limitations (financial, geographic, etc.)
  - Some parts are beyond anyone's control
  - Make sure you are staying healthy

- Seek immediate help


