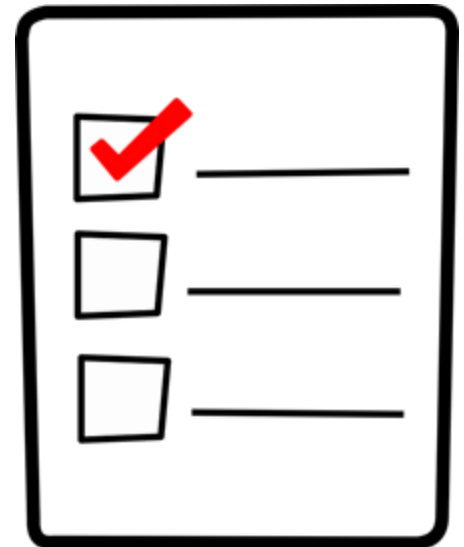

IVC Steps to Complete Matriculation

- Step 1: Apply for admission to IVC (required)
- Step 2: Submit Transcripts
- Step 3: Apply for Financial Aid
- Step 4: Orientation
- Step 5: Advisement/First Semester Plan
- Step 6: Register for Classes



All steps need to be completed by April 13, 2019 for Freshman Advantage Program

There is no more placement testing!

- Due to the implementation of AB 705, IVC will no longer offer the Math and English Assessment. Students will now be required to attend an Orientation Workshop that will present items pertaining to becoming oriented with the campus and services. At the end of the presentation students will then complete a self-guided placement survey and submit a copy of their HS transcript. These items will provide students with a placement within 24 hours of attending the workshop.
- IVC – No H.S. Preview Day for 2019! *Will continue Freshman Advantage Program, Laser week (in August) and will hold weekly campus tours.*

- 93% of admitted transfers to the UC's come from the community college system

Admission & Requirements: Apply to IVC and complete the matriculation process

- Submit an application packet containing:
 - A signed, completed Honors Program application form with personal statement responding to application prompt
 - Official high school transcript reflecting a cumulative 3.25 non-weighted academic GPA
 - A signed, sealed letter of recommendation from a high school teacher or counselor

“a-g” UC/CSU Course Requirements

***Grades must be a “C-” or better**

- 4 years of English
- 3 years of Math (Alg. 1/Math 1, Geom./Math 2, Alg. 2/Math 3)
- 2 years of Lab Science (Biological and Physical)
- 2 years/levels of the same World Language
- 1 year of Visual/Performing Art
- 1 year of Global Perspectives
- 1 year of US History
- 1 semester of Political Science/Economics
- 1 year of College Prep. Electives (“g” elective)

***These are minimum requirements and do not guarantee admission to college or university**

CSU Admissions Eligibility

CSU Admissions Index:

- $\text{GPA} \times 800 + \text{SAT (CR + M)} = 2950 \text{ Minimum}$ OR
 $(10 \times \text{ACT}) + (200 \times \text{GPA}) = 695 \text{ Minimum}$
- If standard (not impacted) admission, GPA of 3.0 eligible with ANY score for non-impacted campuses
- If selective admission, index required may vary by campus and/or major



What makes a CSU campus “selective?”

Campus Impaction: Occurs when a campus receives more eligible applications in the initial filing period than there are enrollment spaces available

CSU Campuses fall into 3 categories:

- Non-impacted-admit using CSU eligibility
- Campus impaction (Freshmen, Transfer, majors)
- Impacted in all programs (all majors)

CSU Timeline



Application due November 30th

- Send official test scores directly from testing agency.
 - Note: Some colleges will not accept the December test date, please do your research.
- **After application has been submitted, student will receive an e-mail from each CSU to open an account**
 - Check account on a weekly basis; your student could miss a deadline!
 - Some CSUs may ask for a 7th semester transcript.
 - **Final Transcript must be sent through Parchment.com!**

- November 1 – 30 -----> Filling Period**
- November 30 -----> Send test scores directly from testing agency**
- Oct 1 - March 1 -----> FAFSA deadline (Cal Grant)**
- March 1 - 31 -----> Admissions Notification**
- May 1 -----> Student Intent to Register (SIR) Deadline**
- May 14 -----> English Writing Exam**
- July 1 -----> Final Transcripts due**

- These questions are meant to let a student's unique voice and personality shine through.

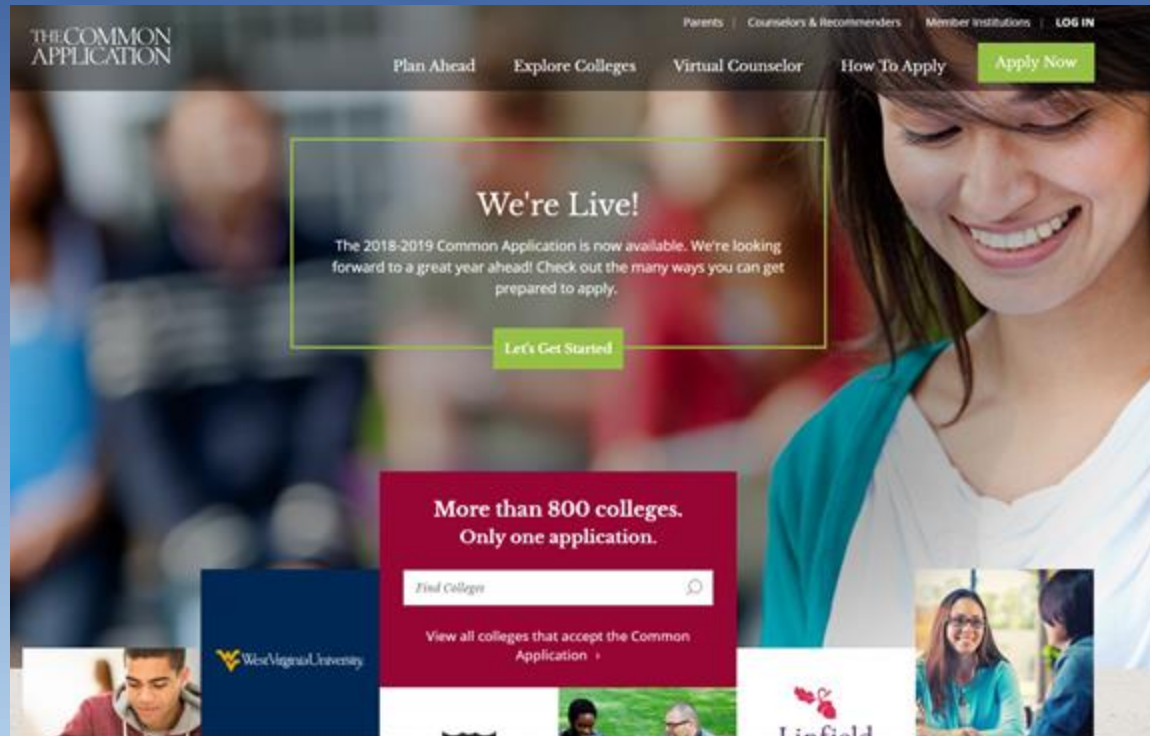

The Common Application

- ✓ Many schools (600+) use the Common Application
- ✓ Student's can access the Common Application NOW!
- ✓ Many applications require Letters of Recommendations from Teachers and/or Counselors
- ✓ Requirements vary from school to school
- ✓ Students must check to see if their colleges are using the Common Application. If their colleges are not, students must check each college's website for application details.



Letters of Recommendation

- Students must pick up a counselor recommendation packet from Ms. Cochran in the counseling office.
- Student's request a recommendation from counselor on Common App
- Packet must be complete before they make an appointment
- Student's go to parchment.com to order their transcripts
- Please allow the counselor at least 2 weeks to write the letter
- No letters will be written over Winter Break (12/22/18 - 1/6/19)



OUT-OF STATE

WHAT TO CONSIDER:

- Merit/Need-based scholarships to offset out-of-state fees
- Pay 150% of in-state fees through Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE)

How to send transcripts



In Person:

- ❖ Visit Parchment.com. Creating an account takes 5 minutes
 - ❖ Make sure you select University High School in Irvine
- ❖ Cost is 5.50
- ❖ Send official transcripts online to:
 - ❖ Common Application
 - ❖ Colleges not on the Common Application
 - ❖ Privates, Out of State schools, NCAA
 - ❖ Final transcripts to UC's and CSU's
- ❖ Orders can be tracked
- ❖ Note the following dates:
 - ❖ Present: initial transcripts
 - ❖ January 28: first semester grades post

Orders will not be processed between Dec 21-Jan 4

 - ❖ June 14: final transcript are available to order
 - ❖ June 21: LAST day to order final transcripts
 - ❖ Allow 3 business days for orders to process
- ❖ Scholarship applications
- ❖ Summer Programs
- ❖ Mail transcripts for colleges not on Parchment Exchange
- ❖ PDF files of transcripts
- ❖ Cost is \$5 cash

 - They can't go wrong with their name; it helps colleges find their records.

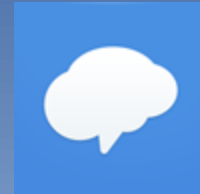
College Admissions Stress

 - Some parts are beyond anyone's control

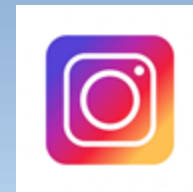

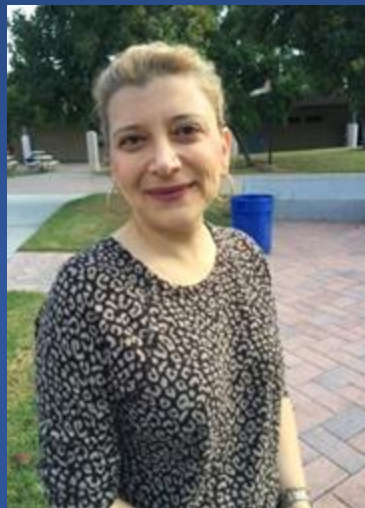
