Academic Support Resources

Office Hours: 45 minute periods on Wed. & Thurs. during the school day. This time is for students to get help from teachers, make-up tests and labs, work with peers on group projects, make-up PE time, and work on assignments in the Library or Computer Labs.

IMPACT/Homeroom: Programs designed to create a smooth transition for incoming freshmen which provides opportunities for freshmen to establish an early connection to high school. IMPACT Connection meetings are conducted by upperclassmen leaders and mentor teachers during Homeroom – a 15 minute period on Fridays to keep students updated on school news, events, and grade appropriate information.

Homework Lab: A quiet place to study or use the computers after-school in the library for one hour.

Peer Tutoring: Teachers and volunteer students are available to help in any academic subject. Tutoring is held Mondays through Thursdays, after school, in Room 319 for one hour.

Parent Portal: Report Cards will NOT be mailed home. All parents should have an online MyIUSD Parent Portal account to check attendance and grades. Progress reports, quarter grade reports, and semester grade reports will be posted on the Parent Portal for parents' viewing. Course Selection for 10th Grade

1. English 2 (CP or Honors)
2. US History (CP or AP)
3. Chemistry (CP or Honors)

6. PE (Sports/Band/Dance) or Elective

If students do not pass the **PE physical fitness** test they are mandated to take PE in 10th grade.

Honors Science and **Enhanced Math** placement depends on grades and teacher recommendation

Honors English depends on performance in previous English class and teacher recommendation

AP US History placement depends on grades, teacher recommendation and/or passing the DBQ (took place on 3/21)

The schedule allows for a 7-period day if a student enrolls in an "open elective" course (Orchestra, Band, Choir, Madrigals*, Canta Bella*, Adv. Theater Productions*, ASB, Yearbook*, Journalism, Advanced Video Production*)

Where is the Summer School information and how do I sign up?

For summer school information go to the IUSD website (www.iusd.org), click on the summer school registration button, then follow the directions to fill out your online **Course Request and Confirmation Page**.

Turn in the completed **Course Request and Confirmation Page** in person at University High School on the dates listed above for in person classes and to the IUSD Learning Center for Blended Classes. How do I know if my student needs summer school?

If your student received a D or an F in a class first semester, or is in danger of receiving a D or F in a class second semester, you should sign up your student for summer school to repeat that class. Counselors will send home summer school notification emails in April to recommend courses students should take.

What are some appropriate classes for my 9th grader to take?

It is possible for your student to take Health or PE over summer, but it is not necessary. Your student will have room to fit these graduation requirements in their schedules during the regular school year. There are very few options in terms of electives, the majority of summer school offerings are for remediation purposes. Please refer to the summer school course catalog for details.
