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
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The High School

University High School is a comprehensive high school in Orange County, California, with an enrollment of 2,171 students. The school's 55-acre campus is in close proximity to several institutions of higher learning, including the University of California, Irvine, Concordia University and Chapman University. In addition, University High School is the home of the Orange County Deaf and Hard of Hearing program with an enrollment of 62 students who fully participate in the school's academic, athletic and activities programs. Ninety-seven percent of University High School graduates enter post-secondary educational programs.

University High School students have consistently been successful in national and state academic awards programs such as the National Merit Scholarship Program, the Siemens Foundation Awards Program and the Robert C. Byrd Scholarship Program. Approximately 80% of our graduating seniors have/will meet a minimum college preparatory course of study.

University High School is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC). University High School is frequently recognized by



national publications for being an outstanding college prep high school. In the past several years alone, University High School has appeared on top high school lists compiled by the Washington Post, Newsweek and US News and World Report. In 2015, University High School had the honor of being labeled a Gold Ribbon School, which honors outstanding, innovative schools throughout the state of California.

The school's mission is to enable each student to become a contributing member of society with an appreciation for complexity and ambiguity, empowered with the knowledge, skills, and values necessary to meet the challenges of a changing world by providing the highest quality educational experience we can envision.



In determining Grade Point Average, one point per semester is added for each course taken from Advanced Placement and specific Honors level courses as noted on the transcript.

Transcript Data:

Academic GPA: This represents marks earned during grades 9-12. Excluded are non-college preparatory courses, physical education, athletics, and courses earning a grade of "Pass" or "Credit".

Total GPA: This represents marks earned during grades 9-12. Excluded are courses earning a mark of "Pass" or "Credit".

Courses taken at the middle school that are not on the University High School transcript include Algebra 1 or a higher level mathematics course and some Level 1 World Language courses.

Community Service is not required for graduation. However, students who complete 25 hours or more of voluntary community service during the school year are eligible to receive a notation on the transcript.

Academic Honesty and Integrity:

All students are expected to demonstrate honesty and integrity while in attendance at University High School and each student signs an Academic Honesty Contract. Students are expected to do their own work. This includes test taking, homework, class assignments and the creation of original essays, compositions, term papers and scientific research.

University High School: Curriculum

University High School offers a rigorous academic curriculum. The majority of classes are offered at the College Preparatory level. Students who meet course prerequisites may enroll in Honors and Advanced Placement courses. There are eight class periods during the regular school day. A full schedule is six classes. An optional seventh or eighth class is available for students who participate in Drama, Music, Leadership, Journalism, Yearbook/Photojournalism, and Athletics (for 11th and 12th grade only). Transcripts and Reporting

Students who attend San Joaquin High School (IVA) may have mixed transcripts, with courses from their home-site along with courses from SJHS listed separately on their transcripts. The 2022-23 senior class will be graduating and receiving a diploma directly from San Joaquin HS. Courses taken at their home-site high school, will be labeled as such and reported as such on college applications.

San Joaquin High School (IVA)

San Joaquin High School (IVA) is the alternative education high school in Irvine Unified School District which holds WASC accreditation, A-G course approval and NCAA approval. San Joaquin High School (IVA) serves 130+ students this year, with a senior class size of 48 (as of fall 2022). IUSD offers this model to serve students and families throughout the district who opt for an independent and virtual educational experience. Students attend school synchronously for two hours each week through a virtual platform and use approved curriculum, assessments, and resources.

Who attends San Joaquin High School (IVA)

Students from any IUSD high school have the option to enroll in the virtual independent study program. Students commit to stepping away from their home-high school and enrolling in San Joaquin HS (IVA). Students have the option to continue through the entire 22-23 school year, or to return to their home high school at any point in the year. Students have the option of blending San Joaquin HS (IVA) classes from their home school site into their schedule, in an effort to open up access to all students. Students from other IUSD campuses can also blend courses at IVA.

San Joaquin HS (IVA) Curriculum and Sequencing

San Joaquin HS (IVA) has a comprehensive curriculum that matches the academic programming that students would have available at their home-site high school. San Joaquin HS (IVA) supporting all five high schools, and has their own course sequence that meets the graduation and college readiness needs of its students. IVA began its own independent course sequence last year. The core course sequence is outlined and linked at the bottom of this document. Last year, all IVA seniors were considered graduates and were included in date at their home-site school.

GPA and Ranking

In line with other IUSD schools, San Joaquin HS does not rank students. SJHS will provide decile rankings upon special request from colleges and scholarships based on the student's non-weighted GPA. This is to balance the differences between all of the IUSD home-site course sequencing. When evaluating student weighted GPA, each student should be considered within the context of the curriculum available to them through IVA.
