
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The High School

University High School is a comprehensive high school in Orange County, California, with an enrollment of 2,295 students. The school's 55-acre campus is in close proximity to several institutions of higher learning, including the University of California, Irvine, Concordia University and Chapman University. In addition, University High School is the home of the Orange County Deaf and Hard of Hearing program with an enrollment of 75 students who fully participate in the school's academic, athletic and activities programs. Ninety-nine percent of University High School graduates enter post-secondary educational programs.

University High School students have consistently been successful in national and state academic awards programs such as the National Merit Scholarship Program, the Siemens Foundation Awards Program and the Robert C. Byrd Scholarship Program. Over 80% of our graduating seniors have/will complete a minimum college preparatory course of studies.

University High School is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC). University High School is frequently recognized by national publications for being an outstanding college prep high school. In the past several years alone, University High School has appeared on top high school lists compiled



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by the Washington Post, Newsweek and US News and World Report. In 2015, University High School had the honor of being labeled a Gold Ribbon School, which honors outstanding, innovative schools throughout the state of California.

The school's mission is to enable each student to become a contributing member of society with an appreciation for complexity and ambiguity, empowered with the knowledge, skills, and values necessary to meet the challenges of a changing world by providing the highest quality educational experience we can envision.

University High School supports a diverse student body. Our 2,295 students come from many different countries of the world, and a percentage of our students self identify with multiple ethnicities.



In determining Grade Point Average, one point per semester is added for each course taken from Advanced Placement and specific Honors level courses as noted on the transcript.

Transcript Data:

Academic GPA: This represents marks earned during grades 9-12. Excluded are non-college preparatory courses, physical education, athletics, and courses earning a grade of "Pass" or "Credit".

Total GPA: This represents marks earned during grades 9-12. Excluded are courses earning a mark of "Pass" or "Credit".

Courses taken at the middle school that are not on the University High School transcript include Algebra 1 or a higher level mathematics course and some Level 1 World Language courses.

Community Service is not required for graduation. However, students who complete 25 hours or more of voluntary community service during the school year are eligible to receive a notation on the transcript.

Academic Honesty and Integrity:

All students are expected to demonstrate honesty and integrity while in attendance at University High School and each student signs an Academic Honesty Contract. Students are expected to do their own work. This includes test taking, homework, class assignments and the creation of original essays, compositions, term papers and scientific research.

University High School: Curriculum

University High School offers a rigorous academic curriculum. The majority of classes are offered at the College Preparatory level. Students who meet course prerequisites may enroll in *Honors and Advanced Placement courses*. There are six class periods during the regular school day. An optional seventh class is available for students who participate in Drama, Music, Leadership, Journalism, and Yearbook/Photojournalism. San Joaquin High School (IVA) is the alternative education high school in Irvine Unified School District which holds WASC accreditation, A-G course approval and NCAA approval. San Joaquin High School (IVA) serves 2500+ students this year, with a senior class size of 515. IUSD designed this academic model in response to COVID-19 for students and families who needed to remain at home for safety reasons. Students attend school daily through a virtual platform and use approved curriculum, assessments, and resources.

Transcripts and Reporting

Students who attend one or more semesters with San Joaquin High School (IVA) will have this indicated on their transcript. Transcripts will be sent by the students "home" high school - which will be the school of record on the transcript. Each course taken will be recorded on their transcript under the heading "San Joaquin High School". Students will report these classes on their applications as courses taken at "San Joaquin HS".

Who attends San Joaquin High School (IVA)

Students from all five comprehensive high schools had the option to enroll at the beginning of the school year. Students commit to stepping away from their home-high school and enrolling in San Joaquin HS (IVA) for the fall semester or the year. Students' have the option to continue through the entire 20-21 school year, or to return to their home high school after semester one. Students have the option of blending classes from their home school site into their schedule, in the case that the course is not offered at San Joaquin HS (IVA).

San Joaquin HS (IVA) Curriculum and Sequencing

San Joaquin HS (IVA) has many options that match the curriculum that students would have available at their home-site high school. Since San Joaquin HS (IVA) is supporting all five high schools, all with different programs and course sequences, content and course names may not fit an exact match to the sequencing at each home high school. Course offerings are matched based on what would be available at the students home high school. The course limits, grade level enrollment opportunities, dual-enrollment opportunities and grading scale are all dependent on the parameters set by the students' home high school. Grade point average, grading scales and class decile determination will be calculated through the student's home-site. Academic achievement data and curriculum expectations should be considered from the students' home site.
