

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<i>Everything's an Argument</i>	Corresponding Assignment due when you enter the classroom week one:
Chapter 1 Pages 3-30	Read and take notes on the chapter. Write out the answers to the following tasks within this chapter: P. 17, 26 (Skip the task on p. 30)
Chapter 2 Pages 31-44	Read and take notes on the chapter. Write out the answers to ONE of the following “tasks” within the chapter: P. 34-35 OR P. 43— #1
Chapter 3 Pages 45-56	Read and take notes on the chapter. EVERYONE will write out the answer to the task on p. 56— #3 only If you do not have social media, choose a well-known public figure who does and apply #3 to their social media site.
Chapter 4 Pages 57-77	Read and take notes on the chapter. EVERYONE will write out the answer to the task on p. 77
