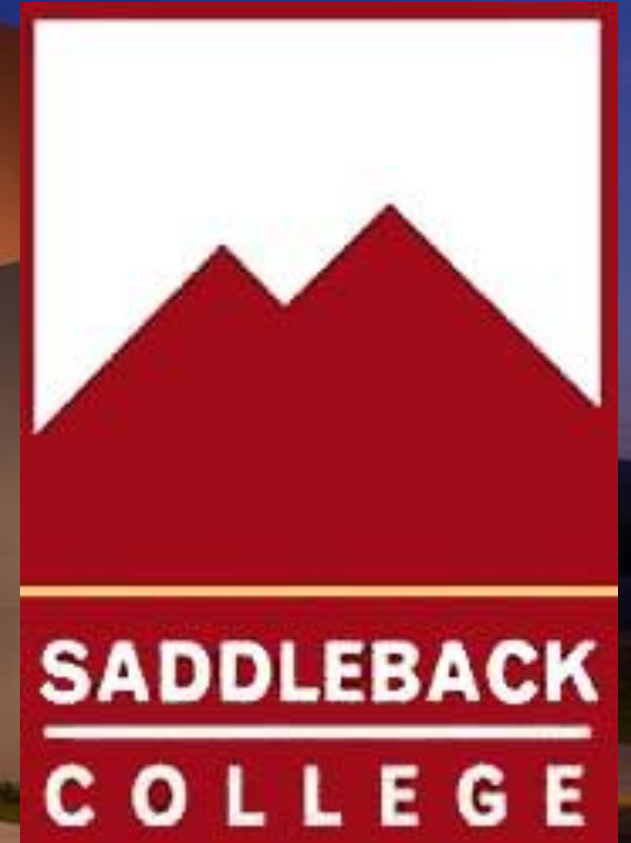

Top Reasons to Attend a Community College:

- ✓ **Cost**
 - Approx. \$1,104 per year for tuition
 - Promise Program (two years free tuition for CA residents)
- ✓ **Transfer Rates and Programs (TAG/TAP)**
- ✓ **Undecided on Major**
- ✓ **Good teaching and small class sizes**
- ✓ **Honors Program**
- ✓ **Students can mature and improve study skills**

- **GPA (Grades 10 and 11 for eligibility)**
- **Rigor of course schedule (AP/Honors)**
- **Personal Insight Questions**
- **Extracurricular activities**
- **Special talents**
- **Academic accomplishments in light of life experiences and special circumstances**

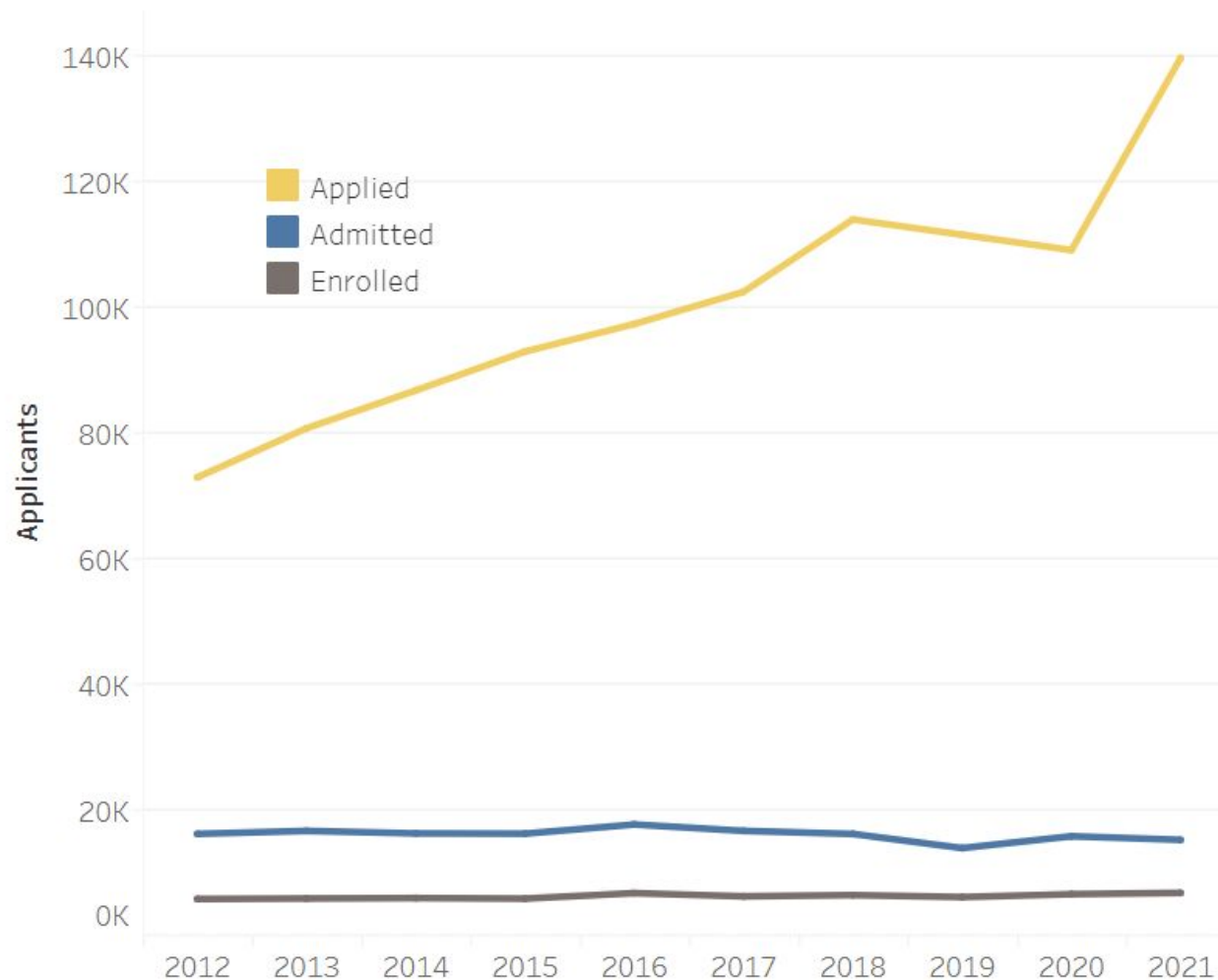

WHAT TO CONSIDER WHEN APPLYING:

- Private colleges can offer generous financial aid packages
- Every school has different requirements
 - Research requirements for colleges you're interested in
- Most schools accept the Common Application
 - www.commonapp.org
- Letters of recommendation from teachers
- Counselor recommendation packets

OUT-OF STATE

WHAT TO CONSIDER:

- Merit/Need-based scholarships to offset out-of-state fees
- Pay reduced tuition and fees through Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE)

Standardized Testing

SAT/ACT Testing

- CSU: Test Blind
- UC: Test Blind
- Private Schools: Check website of specific school for most current info

CollegeBoard Updates

- SAT Subject Tests discontinued by CollegeBoard
- SAT Essay also discontinued

APPLICATION DEADLINES

Regular Decision

Standard deadline for colleges

Rolling Admissions

Considers each application as soon as required information has been received

Early Action

Considered non-binding. You will receive your admission decision earlier, but you are not required to attend

Early Decision

Binding decision - if you are admitted, you must attend the college

Restrictive Early Action

You may not apply to an EA, REA, or ED program at any private college/university in the US

Should I Apply Early or Regular?

Factors to Consider:

- ❑ College search complete or still exploring options?
- ❑ School is a top choice (ED: #1 choice) with multiple reasons it is a match academically, socially, geographically, financially
- ❑ GPA/Transcript through 11th Grade
 - 7th semester considered for RD only
- ❑ SAT/ACT testing (If required by school applying to)
 - Complete or planning to re-test?
- ❑ Timeframe of application due dates
 - Additional 2 months to complete essays/applications for RD

We always encourage students to apply to 1 or 2 reach schools.

Students also need to investigate less selective schools that they would be happy to attend.



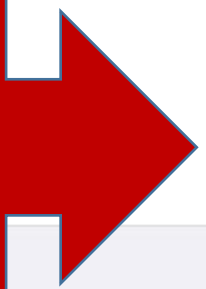
